

















Ministry of Agriculture

Business Risk Management Branch

Mandate: Improves access to capital and enables investment by helping producers manage risks that cause income losses and lead to financial instability, including weather hazards, natural disasters, wildlife, diseases, pests and market declines.

Mandate: Works directly with the agriculture, food and seafood sectors in all areas of B.C. to build industry capacity by supporting: business development, First Nations agriculture, youth development, farm succession, new entrants, and agroforestry. Provides in-depth knowledge of the opportunities, challenges and needs of various sectors, and the emergency preparedness and coordination required for the agriculture and food sector in B.C.

Mandate: Supports the sustainability and prosperity of the agri-food, meat and seafood industries, while serving to protect the well-being of the people of the province; accomplished through education and awareness, inspection and regulatory compliance, surveillance, risk assessment, and development of policy, programs and strategies to address identified risks.

Plant and Animal Health Branch

Mandate: To diagnose, monitor, and assist in the prevention, control and management of plant and animal pests and diseases in B.C. through surveillance, regulatory compliance, risk assessment, and the development of strategies to address identified risks.

Farm Industry Review Board

Mandate: Government appointed independent administrative tribunal responsible for supervising BC's eight regulated marketing boards under the Natural Products Marketing (BC) Act (NPMA), and hearing appeals and complaints under the NPMA, Farm Practices Protection (Right to Farm) Act and the Prevention of Cruelty to Acidente Actions (Action 1). and the Prevention of Cruelty to Animals Act.

- Key Responsibilities:
 Supervise BC's marketing boards and commissions
 Signatory to federal-provincial agreements
 Hear appeals of marketing board and commission decisions
 Hear appeals of BCSPCA animal custody and cost decisions
 Hear farm practices nuisance complaints
 Conducts farm practices studies

Organization overview:

Up to 10 part-time members appointed by the Lieutenant Governor in Council supported by full-time staff.

Agricultural Land Commission

Mandate: Government appointed independent administrative tribunal responsible for administering the Agricultural Land Commission Act, which governs the use of land in the Agricultural Land Reserve, and is dedicated to preserving agricultural land and encouraging farming in British Columbia.

Key Responsibilities: • Considers applies

- Considers applications to include & exclude ALR land; and for subdivision and non-farm use in the ALR
- Ensure local government plans & by laws are compatible & encourage farming in the $\ensuremath{\mathsf{ALR}}$
- Enforce complaints of non-compliant activities in ALR

Organization Overview:

- Executive Committee includes an appointed Chair and six Vice Chairs
- Six appointed regional panels include a Chair and two members

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Key Issues for BC's Agrifood Sector

- Key benefit for B.C.'s agriculture sector is elimination of tariffs.

 For example, B.C.'s fresh, frozen and sweetened cranberries are eligible for the elimination of tariffs of up to 30% in Vistnam.
 - B.C.'s pork sector is eligible for the graduation elimination of tariffs of up to 20% in Japan.

Since 2017, twelve on property protests, and multiple other anti-livestock agriculture campaigns relating to animal activists (in the regulated sectors of poultry, hog, and dairy).

Animal Welfare Codes of Practice
 The Animal Care Codes of Practice Regulation (the Regulation) came into force on June 1, 2019, under the PCA Act, to provide further protection for farm animals by establishing reasonable and generally accepted practices of animal management

Marketing Boards in Agriculture

- The Minister is responsible for recommendations to Lieutenant Governor in Council for public appointment positions.
- What is CABRO?
 - Crown Agencies and Board Resourcing Office
 - CABRO is a government group that oversees the open, transparent and merit-based public appointment process.
- Government is especially focused on:
 - Board diversity
 - Governing in the Public Interest
